Connecting During a Crisis

There's no hyperbole in labeling 2020 as a year for the history books. Even as we at CFCV moved quickly to continue best-practice operations during the Covid-19 Pandemic, we focused on our mission and values detailed at right. No matter what, the strength of our organization depends on connections: joining our donors with issues they care about, supporting nonprofits to help them work more effectively and efficiently, and bringing our community together in collaborations that move us all forward together.

We're proud of our coronavirus response (see the story in this issue) and will continue that work as long as it's needed. Additional connections are helping us hear and amplify underheard voices in our community.

Despite the pandemic, philanthropists at all levels embraced contributing through our Community Foundation; growing charitable assets through our careful, strategic investing; and using CFCV as a resource, encourager and convener for good things throughout the community. Their work this year accomplished some real milestones:

- The generosity of some **1,100 donors** nudged our net assets to \$204 million by year-end: a significant milestone, especially in only 22 years of history.
- CFCV received **more than 1,407 gifts totaling \$33 million** (including inter-fund gifts), bringing the total contributions received since our founding to more than **\$338 million**.
- We made **1,896 grants totaling nearly \$17 million** (again, including inter-fund grants) from what now numbers **335 active Funds**.
- Since we began, we have made a **total of more than \$194 million in grants to the community**, underlining our growing position as a center of thoughtful philanthropy for the Chattahoochee Valley.
- Still, because of the support from our Founder's Society Endowment, **no more than one cent of each dollar contributed** goes toward administrative costs.

Our size now places us among the larger community foundations in the Southeast and enhances our potential for impact. We mean to use our voice to promote listening, learning and generosity to fuel progress in this place that we love.

Linking Young Musicians to Successful Adulthoods

Professional violinist Lynn Whiddon attended the prestigious Eastman School of Music in New York State and performed with symphonies nationwide, but Columbus is where she left her most indelible mark. As associate concertmaster of the Columbus Symphony Orchestra, she was the driving force behind the creation of the Youth Orchestra of Greater Columbus in 1993.

Some 28 years later, YOGC annually serves about 350 young people across five counties and more than 30 schools, through five performance and teaching programs. Its best-known String and Symphony Orchestra Program numbers more than 100 budding musicians in two ensembles, who perform in professional concert halls such as the RiverCenter for the Performing Arts.

Given Whiddon's contributions, it's only fitting that the Youth Orchestra's Endowment Fund, which was created at the Community Foundation in 2014, bears her name, says YOGC Executive Director Stephanie Payne. "She said that the Youth Orchestra was her greatest achievement outside of her family and children, so having that as a way to keep her legacy alive is amazing," Payne says.

While Payne is a talented musician herself, having played the flute since she was 8, one thing she's not is an investment manager. ("I know about the stock market, but not enough to oversee a long-term investment entrusted to the organization," she says with a laugh.) That's why she and her board members are grateful to be able to "outsource" the day-to-day management of the Lynn Whiddon Youth

Orchestra of Greater Columbus Endowment Fund to CFCV. This lets them focus on what they really love—helping aspiring young musicians nurture their talent, and ushering those students into adulthood as citizens who appreciate beauty and understand the importance of working together.

"If we didn't have the Community Foundation, we either would not be able to have an endowment, or it would have to be managed by someone else—and I can guarantee that would be more expensive, and without the economies of scale we benefit from with the vast resources that the Community Foundation handles," she says. "I've been especially impressed with what they've managed to achieve even through the ups and downs of the pandemic."

Best of all, anyone can contribute to the Youth Orchestra Endowment at any time, helping the Fund grow and provide even more support for the organization's work.

JJ Musgrove, CFCV's director of donor services, stresses that endowments can be the key to long-term stability for organizations like YOGC. "The Community Foundation is focused on long-term results, so our investment strategy is going to be focused on 20, 30, 50 years from now, as opposed to a five-year plan or some shorter outlook," he explains. "That allows their money to weather the ups and downs of a volatile market and still provide reliable annual payouts to support the organization's operations. We're able to give them an opportunity to really focus on their mission, while we focus on helping them be the strongest organization financially they can be."

Beauty and Pride Unite Neighborhoods

Some are as grand as wall-sized murals. Others are as simple as a chair. But they're all part of the Community Foundation's efforts, supported by the Knight Foundation Donor Advised Fund, to enhance pride in Columbus' diverse neighborhoods and connect them to one another.

"The common thread of these grants is the idea of beauty, pride and connection," says Kelli Parker, CFCV's director of grants and community partnerships. "They all have components of public art, they're all in different parts of the community, and they're all opportunities to bring together people whose paths may not otherwise cross."

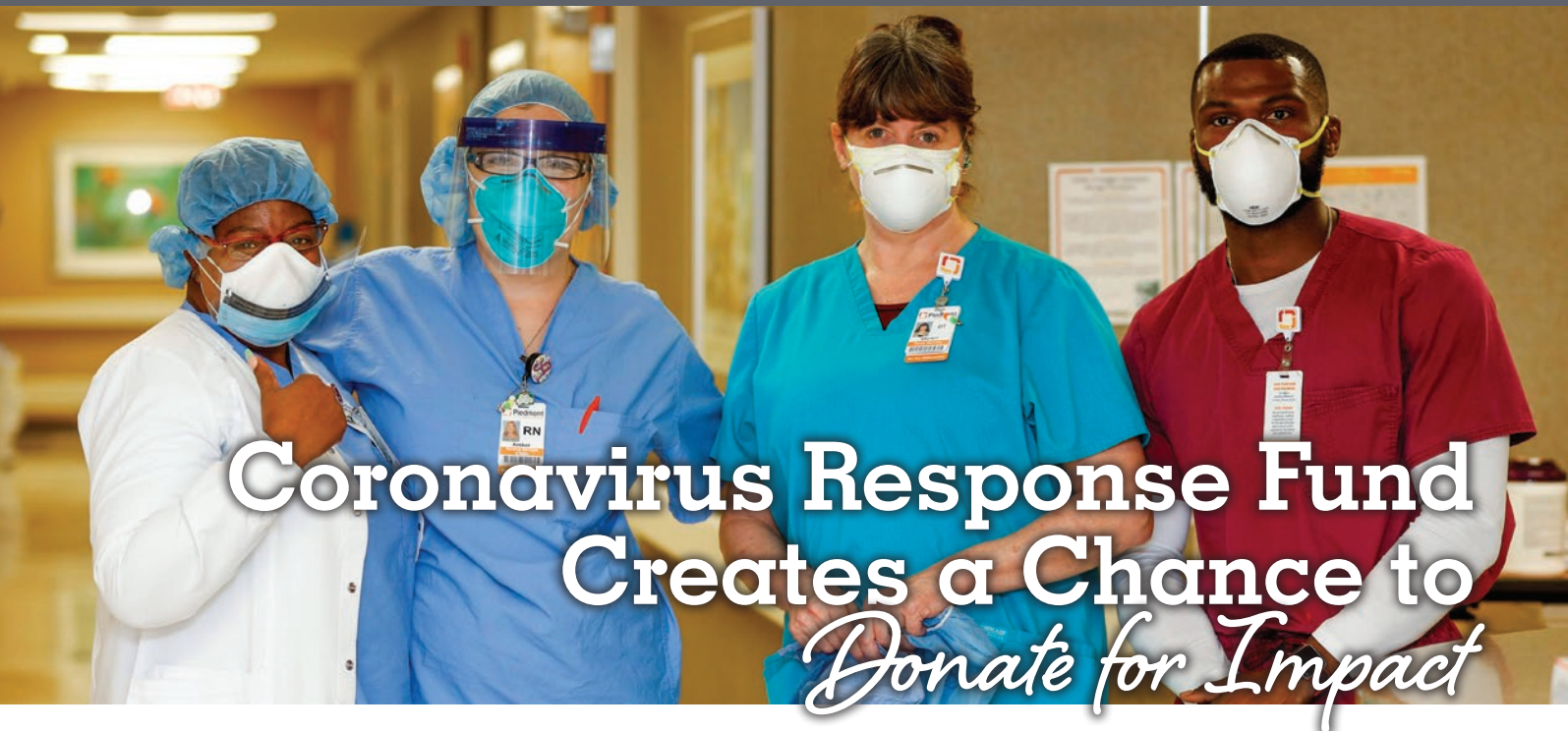
Beneficiaries include *Advocacy Through Art*, a project led by Columbus State University to spur dialogue about racial justice issues, and *Making Conversations*, a Columbus Museum-led effort using public artwork, an exhibition, and oral history to strengthen relationships with the neighboring Warren Williams Homes public housing development. South Carolina sculptor Deedee Morrison worked directly with Warren Williams residents to design artwork to spotlight the things they love most about where they live.

The Knight Fund also supported *Light Up MidTown*, a collaboration between MidTown, Inc., and CSU's art department, that resulted in a series of murals enhancing an underutilized stretch of 13th Street connecting Midtown and Uptown Columbus. Julio Portillo, MidTown's executive director, describes the art project as the first step in a comprehensive effort to re-imagine a corridor that is heavily traveled but largely ignored.

"We've championed a complete reconfiguration of the street that will bring it from five travel lanes to three, providing for parallel parking on one side and diagonal parking on the other," Portillo explains. That plus the artwork, he hopes, will inspire people to not just drive through but stop and visit for a while—"revitalizing storefronts, revitalizing the overall look, and getting people to regenerate some economic growth."

Amidst COVID-19 social restrictions, CFCV even used chairs left over from public space experiments to create social-distancing-friendly gathering spots in Dinglewood Park. According to Parker, the chairs are used regularly—and all have stayed put, though they shift around as various groups use them.

It's all about providing opportunities for togetherness in organic, casual formats," Parker says. "These creative efforts, and others like it, provide ways for us to enjoy being together, celebrate things that are beautiful, and have common experiences that lower barriers. By connecting people to each other and our community, we're making this an even better place for current and future generations."



The Chattahoochee Valley region has long associated the Community Foundation with attributes like strength, stability, and endurance; in other words, the characteristics of a well-built home designed to stand the test of time.

But when the COVID-19 Pandemic loomed in early 2020, the Community Foundation displayed attributes such as speed and agility—shifting from a solid house to a fine-tuned sports car.

Even before the first coronavirus case was confirmed in Muscogee County, “we were considering its impact and how philanthropy might need to respond,” remembers Betsy Covington, CFCV president and CEO. In mid-March, as it became clear the virus would spread like wildfire, Covington called Ben Moser, president and CEO of the local United Way, to ask how their organizations might collaborate on a response.

“I proposed that we work together to give donors a way to support the community through this crisis. He instantly said yes, and within 24 hours we had the Coronavirus Response Fund up and running at cfcv.com/coronavirus,” Covington recalls. “The partnership is great; the United Way staff is fantastic to deal with. The level of connectedness we’d already developed has made operating this Fund easy, even though its work is very hard. What a tribute to the way things happen in our community!”

Covington and Moser had developed a working relationship almost from the moment Moser came to Columbus in August

2019, so it didn’t take long to devise how the Fund would work. “We agreed we should have board members from each of our organizations govern the grantmaking and potentially help out with the fundraising,” Moser says. “So we elected some board members and created a six-person committee.” What’s more, both organizations are donating their work on the Fund and waiving administrative fees, so every dollar donated can go straight into the community.

That committee has so far distributed more than 90 grants totaling \$1.2 million to organizations in a wide variety of fields that are supporting vulnerable populations. Obviously, health care was a primary consideration, so one of the biggest single grants—made possible by a special gift to the Response Fund—was \$500,000 to help St. Francis–Emory Healthcare expand the hospital’s ICU bed capacity. “That capacity is critical to the community during a pandemic like this,” Moser says. “We’ve also made grants to MercyMed to help support their coronavirus testing program and other hugely valuable services, particularly in some of our most densely populated areas of poverty.”

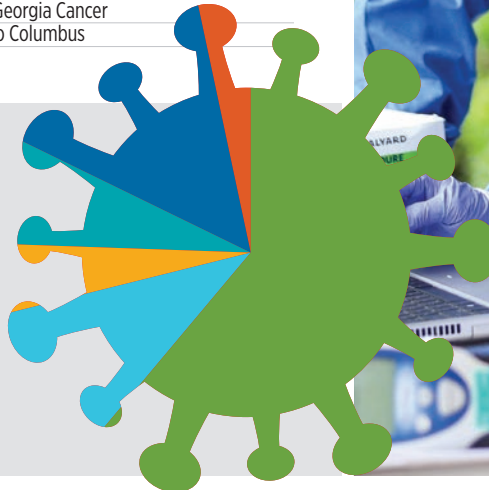
But the committee takes a wide-ranging view of the myriad ways coronavirus is affecting the community. The Coronavirus Response Fund supports organizations that provide food, and rent and utility assistance to those hit hard economically by the crisis, coordinating with United Way’s 211 referral service to ensure that funded services are as broadly accessible

as possible. For schoolchildren struggling to adapt to the new distance-learning normal, the Fund has made grants to area agencies to provide virtual learning centers and mental wellness programs, critical to keeping them from falling behind in their studies. “We’ve even made grants to groups that work with children who are vulnerable to abuse,” Covington adds. “It’s so hard to know what’s happening in every household while people are isolated at home.”

But one of the most important products of the joint effort cost no money at all. “We also came up with the idea to do a daily Community Call, Monday through Friday, to raise awareness of the Fund, to help serve needs in the community, and to be a connection point for organizations in our community that had needs, as well those that could provide services,” Moser says. “It was another part of this effort that we agreed to do very quickly—we held our first call on March 17.”

Since then, everyone from elected officials and healthcare workers to reporters, educators, and even individual members of the community have joined the call to find out where grants are being directed, get public health updates, and discuss emerging concerns. The calls now take place biweekly instead

of daily (details are at cfcv.com/coronavirus), but “over and over, you see people stepping forward and raising their hands because that’s how this community does things,” Covington says with pride. “It’s been very heartening to see such a positive response to something so frightening.”

The success of the local effort prompted the Community Foundation to join a similar effort in the LaGrange area, where the Community Foundation, United Way of West Georgia and the Callaway Foundation manage the Troup County Emergency Relief Fund.

“Early on in this, someone said, ‘We’re likely to come into contact with portions of our community that we’ve never really seen before,’ and boy, I think that is absolutely the case,” Covington says. “In a lot of ways, we have become more aware of our need to build better bridges across racial and socioeconomic lines, and we’re finding plenty of opportunities to do that. It’s such a positive reminder of the value of partnerships in our community, so we’re really proud that the Community Foundation and United Way are able to serve in this role—this is exactly what we believe we’re supposed to be doing.”





Connecting Great Citizens of the Past with *the Community's Future*

From the Springer Opera House to its historic river mills and Ma Rainey's house, the Chattahoochee Valley is known as a region that preserves its past. In recent years, though, it's been placing special emphasis on developing its future.

In 2017, a diverse coalition of government, business, and community leaders came together to create Columbus 2025, a comprehensive strategic plan to maximize the region's competitiveness and prosperity. One of its five Action Areas is "Talented, Educated People," which recognizes that developing the "best and brightest" has to begin even before children start school. Volunteers were pondering how to target that youngest population when Tabettha Getz, Columbus 2025's executive director, came upon an idea, literally out of thin air.

"It was like fate stepped in," Getz says. "I was on my way to work one morning, listening to the radio, and they were interviewing [Harvard economist] Ron Ferguson. He laid out his program, *The Basics*, and I was like, 'There it is. This sounds exactly like what we need.'"

A product of Harvard University's Achievement Gap Initiative, *The Basics* are five evidence-based parenting and caregiving principles that can be life-changing for children of all backgrounds, from birth to age 3. The principles are fun, simple and powerful—and ideally something every child should experience every day.

None of it, Getz is quick to point out, involves complicated training or expensive equipment. But disseminating *The Basics* to the community and getting buy-in from a wide range of stakeholders is where the Community Foundation of the Chattahoochee Valley came in.

In 2020, CFCV committed a landmark three years of

discretionary funding to bring *The Basics* to the Columbus area. Those funds came from CFCV's Community Endowment Funds and two sub-funds, the Moselle W. and H. Quigg Fletcher, Jr. Endowment Fund and the Susan and Butch Cochran Family Fund, named for two families with deep roots in the Chattahoochee Valley and long track records of supporting civic improvement.

"Those Funds were created by families who trust CFCV and believe we'll make strategic decisions to benefit the community," says CFCV President & CEO Betsy Covington. "It's especially poignant that these two families that have meant so much to this area's past are helping make this effort possible for its youngest citizens. And now that neuroscientists have discovered that 80% of brain development happens in the first three years of life, it became urgent to our Board that we invest in these young people in a way that maximizes their chance at a successful future."

One key to *The Basics* (cv.thebasics.org) is that a wide variety of community services and organizations can play a part in promoting it: not just schools and libraries but daycare centers, healthcare providers, and even churches and barbershops—"anyplace where parents take their children," says Grace Nagel, executive director of *The Basics*, which operates out of United Way of the Chattahoochee Valley. When the onset of the coronavirus pandemic forced a quick re-evaluation of the short-term saturation goals for *The Basics*, "we looked for places that were staying open and providing child and family support, and of course that led us to healthcare. No matter what, babies continue to be born and continue to need their wellness checks, so that was a logical place to start."

The Basics is now working with both Piedmont Columbus Regional and St. Francis-Emory Healthcare on “increasing staff awareness, knowledge, and skills and finding easy ways to share the message as kids come in for services.” They’ve also enlisted 12 local pediatricians from eight different clinics to join regular check-in sessions.

But the pandemic hasn’t stopped them from thinking creatively about how to get the word out. *The Basics* collaborated with the Springer Theatre Academy to produce a show called “Deep Blue Sea” in which kids and parents could watch *The Basics* performed in real time. For Nagel, herself an STA alum, “it was like coming home. I knew from

my time in the Academy the importance of live theatre and their motto of ‘building life skills through stage skills.’”

Though the prescriptions of *The Basics* are simple, they can pay real dividends in mental development that will make a tangible difference well into adulthood.

“Children who don’t receive these things often aren’t ready for kindergarten, they don’t read as quickly, and that gap isn’t something that can be made up,” Getz explains. “It even widens as the school years advance. Columbus 2025 puts a focus on creating the kind of community where everybody can succeed and has a quality of life that they enjoy, and *The Basics* is vital to making that possible for everybody.”

DOING GOOD WHILE DOING WELL

Funds can be endowed to exist forever or non-endowed to facilitate short-term giving. Endowed and long-term funds are pooled for investment purposes, maximizing diversification opportunities and returns while lowering fees.

The CFCV can make grants on behalf of its donors to any charitable organization, including churches, educational and governmental institutions, United Ways and — in some cases — in support of individuals or charitable efforts that may not have a 501(c)(3).
