Remaining a Force for Good

Despite the continuing challenges and uncertainties of this past year, the Community Foundation and its donors continued to respond generously to the needs of our communities and our neighbors.

- We made **1,789 grants totaling nearly \$21 million** (including inter-fund grants) from what now numbers **335 active Funds**.

Our organization kept its focus firmly on our mission of “enabling and promoting philanthropy,” and on our bedrock values detailed at right. We know the Chattahoochee Valley increasingly depends on our organization as a force for good, and the grants we made to, for example, improve the lives of children, strengthen the arts, revitalize public space, and support the collaborative regional goals of Columbus 2025 are emblematic of the hope and strength we provide.

Philanthropists at all levels continued to give *through* CFCV at a record rate; grow charitable assets with our careful, strategic investing; and use CFCV as a resource, encourager and convener. Their work this year accomplished some real milestones:

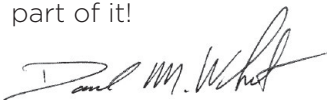
- CFCV received **more than 850 gifts totaling \$53 million** (again, including inter-fund gifts), a new record of giving.
- The generosity of our donors—and the performance of our pooled investments—**grew our net assets to \$284 million, a 40% increase during the year**.

The strength of our organization depends on our work to remain a force for good: connecting our donors with issues they care about, supporting nonprofits to help them work more effectively and efficiently, and bringing our community together in collaborations that move us all forward together.

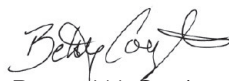

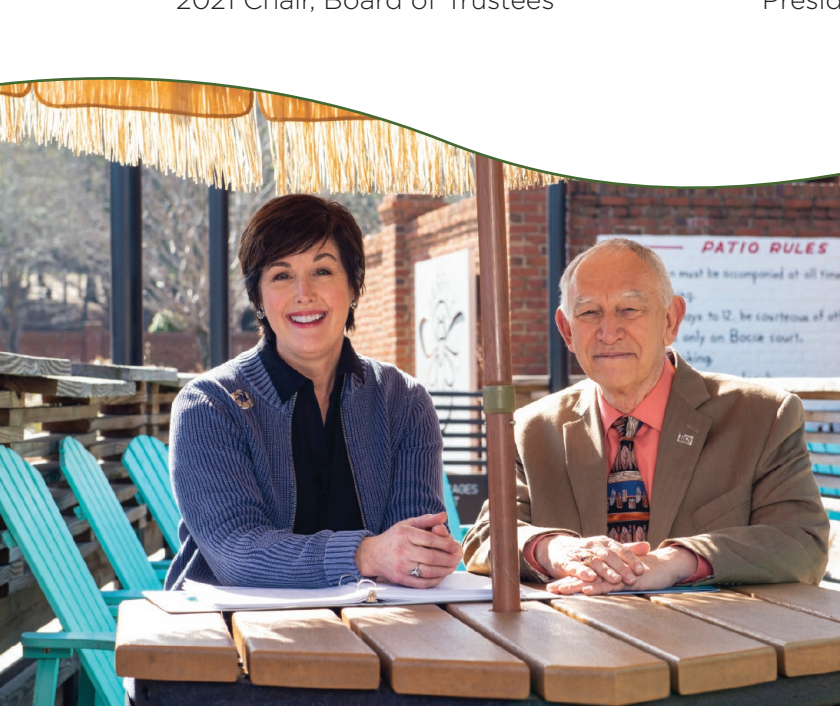

Helping Connect Diverse Development Officers *Across the Country*

In 1998, when Birgit Burton was hired as the first African American frontline fundraiser at Georgia Tech, she realized the numbers of professionals that she knew who looked like her was small, so she went out looking for others to join her.

That same year, she reached out to other African American fundraisers at the Historically Black Colleges and Universities in the Atlanta University Center, near Georgia Tech, and organized a breakfast meeting where they could network and discuss the common challenges they encountered. Over the years, the breakfasts became an annual conference and eventually became the African American Development Officers Network (AADO), a nationwide organization for people of color in the professional fundraising community, with a membership of more than 3,000 strong.

Since 2016, AADO has had a non-endowed Field of Interest Fund with the Community Foundation of the Chattahoochee Valley, a “home” for their work that Burton credits with helping AADO not only grow as an organization, but also support the growth of members and peer organizations alike.

“We have a vehicle for awarding scholarships to conferences and to support other affinity groups that are engaging professionals of color,” says Burton, who is now Georgia Tech’s senior advisor for foundation relations. “That’s what we’re able to support by being

able to send out grants from the AADO Fund within the Community Foundation. And that’s important, because we’ve really needed the relationship with the foundation to support so many groups.”

As of this year, AADO is a 501(c)(3) organization, but it continues its relationship with CFCV to provide members a stable, viable way of supporting their work. “We have to be careful with our organizational capacity to support Funds that raise money from large numbers of donors. But we’re proud of this long relationship with AADO and are thrilled that they have become a strong voice on the national stage,” says Betsy Covington, CFCV president and CEO. “This is a way for us to be an ally for this group and help foster diverse voices in philanthropy.”

Burton adds that AADO isn’t advocating for greater diversity in fundraising just so that fundraisers of color can be “siloeed” into serving exclusively diverse donors and organizations. “Having diversity on the development team helps you grow as a unit and have diversity of thought as to how you’re going to reach ALL donors,” she says. “Nonprofit organizations that are willing to embrace diversity not only create a better environment and culture within their organizations, they also cast a wider net for volunteers and donors. It makes good business sense.”

Coronavirus Response Fund Continues *Community Support*

The COVID-19 pandemic has made a habit of upending expectations. When the Community Foundation and United Way of the Chattahoochee Valley came together to create the Coronavirus Response Fund in early 2020, they knew they were addressing what would become a serious need for people throughout the region, but they didn't know who would be requesting grants—or how long those funds would be needed.

Two years later, nobody's happy that COVID-19 remains a widespread threat, but the Coronavirus Response Fund continues to help the community respond to the pandemic and reduce risk for area citizens.

"We didn't dream two years ago that this was something we'd still be doing, but it's still needed. And we're thrilled that donors have responded generously and that this partnership with United Way is as seamless as it can possibly be," says CFCV President and CEO Betsy Covington. "We're still supporting the organizations that find themselves needing to make pandemic-related differences for our neighbors on the front lines."

Having awarded grants totaling \$1,552,977 to date, a committee of CFCV and United Way board and staff members continues to meet regularly to distribute grants. So far these resources have supported everything from increased food distribution sites; learning-loss prevention programs for area schoolchildren; and critical-care capacity support at area hospitals, like that of converting COVID-area hallway water fountains into warm-water sinks at St. Francis Hospital so that health professionals can wash their hands before entering patients' rooms.

Perhaps most notably, the Fund created a special partnership with the Columbus Consolidated Government, Russell County Commission, the West Central Georgia Health District and a

local private foundation to support a social media influencer campaign to share reliable information about the safety of and need for COVID-19 vaccinations.

"It's a little difficult to tell exactly why people go in to get vaccinated, and we can't directly track these posts to vaccinations," says Ben Moser, president and CEO of United Way, "but our vaccination rate definitely ticked up, and I think some of that was due to this campaign. And to us, anything that shortens the duration of the pandemic and lessens its impact aligns with the purpose of the Fund."



The Coronavirus Response Fund can continue to support such needs thanks to a strong, community-wide initial outpouring of support. That was a good sign, Ben says, as is the fact that applications for grants have been slowly but steadily decreasing in recent months.

"This Fund was designed to be the gap-filler for emergency needs related to the pandemic, but many of those needs have since been 'baked into the cake' of the budgets of the organizations around town," Moser explains. "Hopefully we will emerge from the pandemic soon, and CFCV and United Way can renew our work on other community needs!" 

During Fiscal Year 2021, the Coronavirus Response Fund granted \$438,182 to the following nonprofit organizations, to support their service to our most vulnerable neighbors during the crisis.

Endowing the Whitewater Course

According to Greek philosopher Heraclitus, “No man ever steps in the same river twice.” His point was that the world and everything in it is constantly in flux, which certainly applies to the Chattahoochee River. Although the longest urban whitewater course in the world, running between Columbus and Phenix City, has been a smashing success since it opened in 2013, the river is always changing, and the course needs monitoring and maintenance to ensure that it stays attractive, exciting, and safe.

Ed Kinner has likely put more time into that effort than anyone. A geotechnical engineer by trade, he holds a doctorate degree from MIT and had a successful engineering career before moving to Columbus in 2004 to marry his wife, Beverly. Ed became fascinated by the Chattahoochee River Restoration Project and signed up as a volunteer, providing invaluable expertise to the effort almost from the very beginning. Now, in addition to his time and brainpower, Kinner is supporting the project with funds—he and Beverly established the Whitewater Maintenance Endowment Fund at the Community Foundation in 2020 to support long-term maintenance and upkeep for Columbus’ one-of-a-kind tourist draw.

Anyone can contribute to the Fund, whose Fund Agreement clearly establishes its purpose “to provide funds for systematic upkeep, maintenance and repair of the Chattahoochee River Whitewater Course in Columbus, Georgia, to sustain it as a safe, highly attractive and healthy recreational and environmental venue.” The Kinnners hope that others will join them in supporting this vehicle for permanent support of the project.

“Anything that’s relatively new can be left on automatic for a while without a lot of maintenance, and that’s where whitewater was for a number of years,” Kinner explains. “But starting two or three years ago, I began to think that maybe it needed a little more help than it was receiving at that point. . . . You can’t do much maintenance without money.” Kinner says the Fund is “intended to provide a steady, predictable income for ongoing maintenance of the whitewater project in perpetuity.” Key priorities include maintaining the highwater warning alarm system, keeping the channel clear below the Eagle & Phenix Powerhouse, providing public safety signage, and maintaining Waveshaper Island. Grants are prioritized by the Fund’s Advisors, who include the Mayor of Columbus, the president of the Columbus Water Works, the president of the Community Foundation, Kinner, and John Turner.

Chair of the W.C. Bradley Company and a CFCV board member, Turner also chaired the River Restoration Committee.

Nearly a decade after the whitewater course opened, it’s clear Turner is still passionate about the project as he lists the benefits it provides the Chattahoochee Valley. “I have really enjoyed seeing the original vision come to reality,” he says. “We said that tens of thousands of folks would come every year to get in the river and go rafting, and they have. We said that many times that number would go down just to watch the activity [on the river]; an estimate told us that two million people a year go down to watch. We hoped it would be a catalyst for riverfront development, and just look what’s happening on the river—on both the Phenix City side and the Columbus side.”

Turner also has effusive praise for the man who put in tireless effort—as a volunteer, no less—to ensure that the whitewater course would work. “Ed Kinner is an unbelievable resource, and not just because he’s established this Fund. He’s created both a historical narrative of the project* and a maintenance manual that details everything that’s underneath the water. They’re epic works from a professional engineer. That’s why he established this Fund: he understands the importance of maintaining what’s been constructed.”

For Kinner, the project wasn’t just a complex engineering problem to be solved—it was a labor of love for a town that occupies a special place in his heart. He was further inspired by the way his new hometown united around the whitewater dream. “The project design and construction required teamwork and a commitment by everybody,” he says. “I think everyone from John Turner down to the individual laborers realized they were participating in something that is very special and, essentially, unique.”

And it’s only grown in popularity, Beverly Kinner is quick to add. “For a while it was just the kayakers and active-minded sportsmen. But we were down there last Saturday and there were at least 100 people on Waveshaper Island—families with strollers, little children, even their pets. You could look at their faces and feel the enthusiasm and enjoyment they were experiencing.”

Naturally, the Kinnners have tried out the whitewater course themselves—with differing results. “Beverly has made multiple runs on the course and has never been thrown out of the raft,” Ed says—then adds with a chuckle, “I’ve been thrown out multiple times.”

Scholarship Honors **Beloved Aflac Founder**

"There were two themes that ran through just about everything my dad taught me," says Bettye Cheves. "Work hard, no matter what you're doing, and do it well."

And though he could be a stickler for the details—"He spent probably an hour and a half teaching me the proper way to sweep; I was scattering dust all over the garage," she remembers with a laugh—it was hard to argue with W.L. Amos' philosophy. Together with brothers John and Paul, "Mr. Bill" founded American Family Life Insurance Company of Columbus, which started as a small regional firm but in time became Aflac, now the largest supplemental insurance provider in the United States and insurer of one in four households in Japan.

Mr. Bill also believed that hard work should be rewarded, and big dreams encouraged. That giving spirit lives on in the W.L. Amos, Sr., Scholarship Fund, which Bettye; her husband, Cecil; and their family started at CFCV in 2021 to provide college scholarships for the children and grandchildren of Aflac U.S. employees.

Though the endowment of the Fund is a recent development, it has its roots in a program the Cheves family started in 1999, two years after Mr. Bill's death. "We started rather small, awarding \$500 scholarships to

10 of the employees' children, and we saw that the program was well received," Cecil says. "We increased the dollar amount to \$1,000 and included second-, third-, and fourth-year students. We're in our 24th year now, and we've grown to where the dollar amount is \$2,500, we are giving it to 10 incoming freshmen each year, and we're letting that scholarship continue with the student as long as they're in college—up to four and, if necessary, five years. So a total of 40 scholarships will be awarded every year."

For most of the effort's history, Aflac handled the administration of the scholarships, publicizing the program to the workforce and poring over the applications. By "institutionalizing" the Fund at the Community Foundation, though, Bettye and Cecil are able to endow the program, thus ensuring it will continue in perpetuity. The Community Foundation also annually recruits a selection committee, which includes Amos/Cheves family members, to review applications and recommend recipients to CFCV.

Each year, from January through March, applications for the W.L. Amos, Sr., Scholarship are available at cfcv.com and via Aflac's internal communications.

The essay questions on the application reflect Mr. Bill's emphasis on hard work and integrity, Cecil says. "One of the questions asks them



to describe a project where they had to work hard to achieve something. We also ask about a group of people, other than family, that is meaningful to the applicant; what contributions they have made to the group; and how the group helped them grow personally. You really get to scratch below the surface of the students and hear their heartbeat.”

More than just administering the scholarship, though, Cecil—a former CFCV board chair—and his family appreciate the Community Foundation’s work to steward their resources properly and ensure the Fund’s long-term security. “We have confidence in the way they invest,” he says. “They have professional investors that do a wonderful job, and we know the funds are going to be preserved and even grow. It leaves us with a high confidence that this program will be able to be continued well into the future.”

One of the Cheves’ three daughters, Olivia Cheves Blanchard, says she’s glad to see the endowed scholarship become part of Aflac’s legacy of treating its employees well and giving them and their families every opportunity to succeed. “Through the eyes of a child, I didn’t understand the business side of it, I only saw the loyalty and the love there, to both our family and their employees,” she remembers. “That’s really who my grandfather and uncles were, so it makes sense to me that our family’s support should remain with the people out there working hard and raising families. Those are our kind of people.”

Ironically, William Amos, Sr., never completed college—as Bettye tells it, he was too busy working and putting his brother John through law school. But he still saw great value in education, which is why Bettye is sure he’d be delighted by all the young people getting a chance at college because of the Fund that bears his name. “We just felt that would be something that would make him smile,” she says, “to know that some of what he left us is helping educate Aflac employees’ children. He loved the people he worked with, he really valued them. He knew that without them, the company never would’ve succeeded.”
